THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

The spacious school library is stocked with periodicals, newspapers and an impressive index of titles, covering both fiction and non-fiction. These have been selected for the informative and educational value, catering to all age groups. Children are encouraged to make full use of these facilities in order to foster a healthy reading habit and satiate the inquisitive mind. The library is managed by highly qualified library personnel. In addition, the library also features an integrated audio-visual suite with internet facility to complement the research activities.

MULTI-PURPOSE HALL

The school boasts a multi-purpose hall, used for all major school functions. The multi-purpose hall provides an ideal space for school assemblies, events, productions, minor games, and inter-school activities.

ART ROOM

The school possesses a specialized creative Art Room with internet access where students are encouraged to explore their creative talents and showcase their creative expressions.

MUSIC ROOM

The well-equipped music room provides a variety of instruments including guitars, keyboards and drum sets for students inclined to music.

CAFETERIA

The school cafeteria offers a range of healthy snacks and beverages served throughout the day.

BOOKS AND UNIFORMS STORE

The school houses a book store, which stocks prescribed textbooks, notebooks, stationery, and a range of miscellaneous items at a special price for the convenience of students. The Uniform store stocks prescribed school uniform and in order to maintain uniformity, parents are encouraged to make use of this facility.



Academic

Identity Card

An identity card, with a passport size photograph and the residential address of the student, is issued. This identity card should be borne by each student in school premises all the time.

School Uniform

Summer (Boys) : White shirt, dark brown (coffee colour) half pants/trousers, brown socks and black school shoes.

(Girls) : White blouse, dark brown (coffee colour) tunic / pleated skirt, brown socks and black 'ballet' shoes.

Winter : Plain knit, V-neck wooler, pull over of maroon colour for all.

P.T. Dress : White half sleeved shirt and white half pants (for boys) / skirt (for girls) white canvas P.T. shoes and white socks.

Head Dress : White hair bands and maroon scarves (in winter) for girls. Sikh boys can wear white Patka.

Belt : The school belt is an essential part of the student's uniform. The belt will be provided by the School.

Session

The School Session is from 1st April to 31st March.

Registration

1. Prospectus & registration forms for admission to the school, can be obtained from the school office on cash payment.
2. The forms should be duly filled and submitted with the required documents and certificates as mentioned in the form by the stipulated date.

Test / Interview

1. The registered candidates are called for an admission test / interview.
2. For admission to different classes, test are conducted as per the syllabus of the last class passed.
3. No written or oral test for admission in LKG. Random selection procedure is taken up.

Admission

1. 25% seats are reserved for talented weaker sections of the society in new admissions only.
2. The birth certificate obtained from a competent authority and the transfer certificate obtained from the previous school, are necessary for admission.
3. Fees have to be deposited within seven days of selection, failing which the seat will be allotted to the next waiting candidate.

Morning Assembly

Each working day in starts with the morning assembly marked with the recitation of Vedic Mantras, Devotional Songs and Shanti Path. Students deliver rhymes, speech, news and thought for the day from the dias during Assembly. The assembly disperses with singing of the National Anthem.

Academics

School implements the Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation (CCE) and other educational reforms designed and incorporated by CBSE to fulfill the objectives of

Formative and Summative Evaluation.

A dedicated team of qualified teachers guides and nurtures the children. Individual care, coaching and regular effort is a part of the teaching environment. Learning is joy here, as teachers make their lessons interesting by modern teaching-methods/technique including demonstration, experimentations, project work, assignments, play-way, structural method etc. Education is child centered and signing, mimicry, playing, dramatization etc. are part of holistic teaching/learning.

To be promoted to the next class, minimum of D grade in all subjects and 75% of attendance is necessary.

Parent-Teacher Meeting

In order to establish a meaningful relationship between the school and the parents, meetings are held after every test/evaluation to discuss the progress of each and every student and accordingly Special and remedial classes are arranged.

Attendance

1. 75% attendance is essential for promotion to the next higher class.
2. No leave will be granted except on prior application to the principal.
3. In case of illness, medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner has to be submitted.
4. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained leave for six consecutive days renders the student liable to have his name struck off the rolls.
5. It is compulsory for a student to attend the school on the day before and the day after the summer vacation, the Puja vacation and the winter vacation.

Personal File

The school maintains an individual file for each of its pupils in order to have a systematic record of his/her academic as well as co-curricular progress and achievements. The profile is maintained and updated systematically fulfilling the instructions given in the scheme of CCE.



ACTIVITIES GUIDELINES

Co-Scholastic Activities

House System : To create an atmosphere of healthy competition and team Spirit, most of the school activities are governed by a House System having four houses. Inter House competitions are held regularly under the house flags. Inter-House Quiz Competitions and Plantation Programmes are organised to raise awareness of the importance of a healthy environment.

Nurturing the latent talent : We expose the children to hobbies like reading, sketching, singing, dancing and gardening and ensure that discipline becomes a second nature of the child. Children with similar interests and inclinations are grouped together and then the teachers help them to nurse and cultivate their talents. They are also trained in yoga, martial art and music by experts.

Educational Tours : The School picnics and educational tours for its students. Student-groups are taken to historical places, museums, factories, research institutions etc. to make them familiar with the surroundings they live in.

Games & Sports : To develop a sound health and the qualities of leadership and sportsman spirit children take part in different Inter House, Inter School, Zonal and National Level sports and games activities. Besides, Trekking and adventurous expeditions are also arranged for the students of the Institution.

Value Education : Keeping in view the ideology of the Vedas Sarve Bhavantu Sukhinah and following the message and path of Maharshi Dayanand Help all and Love all and carrying out the committed mission of Mahatma N.D. Grover the children along with their teachers dedicate their resources to impart basic education to the children from weaker section of the society. Books and stationaries are also distributed among the these poor students. The Institution also engaged itself in the task of lending support to different charitable trusts.

Performing Hawans, participation in Vedic Initiation

Camps and Zonal Youth Festivals are mandatory for the children to develop a sound ethical and spiritual base of life.

Withdrawals

1. Withdrawal from school must be preceded by one month's written notice in advance or one month's fee in lieu thereof.
2. All dues will have to be cleared before a Transfer Certificate is issued. The Transfer Certificate will be issued after one week of receipt of the application.
3. The school may ask, without prior notice to the parents, to withdraw their child from the school on any of the these grounds : (a) Academic : Constant neglect of studies of failing in the same class for two consecutive sessions, (b) Disciplinary : those students whose conduct, in the opinion of the Principal, is harmful to the interest of the school.

Guidelines for the Students

1. All the students must possess the school diary, text books, note books, stationery etc. as per the need and instructions give.
2. Students must not bring valuables to the school. The school will not be responsible for the loss of any such article.
3. School bus users must strictly observe the rules of the school transport.
4. Leave-applications must be submitted a day in advance. It should be counter signed by the Parent/Guardian.
5. Students must come in proper school uniform.
6. The school dress should be neat, clean and tidy.
7. Students should obey the House Captains and other students on duty.
8. Students should be regular in their attendance.
